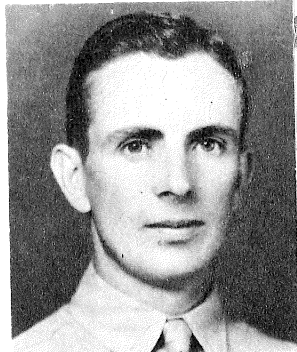


BROTHERS IN SERVICE

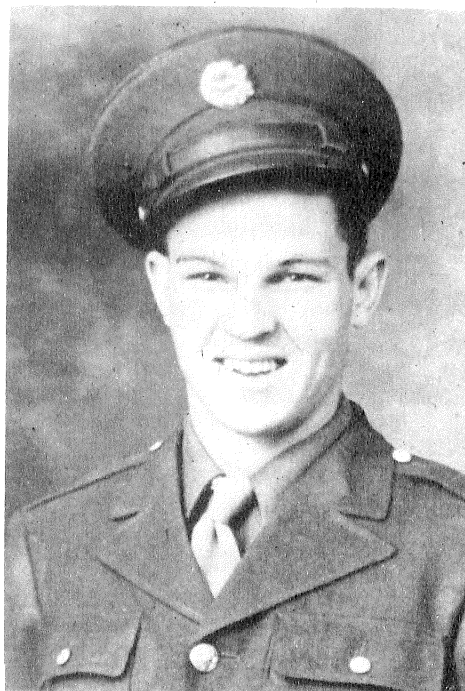
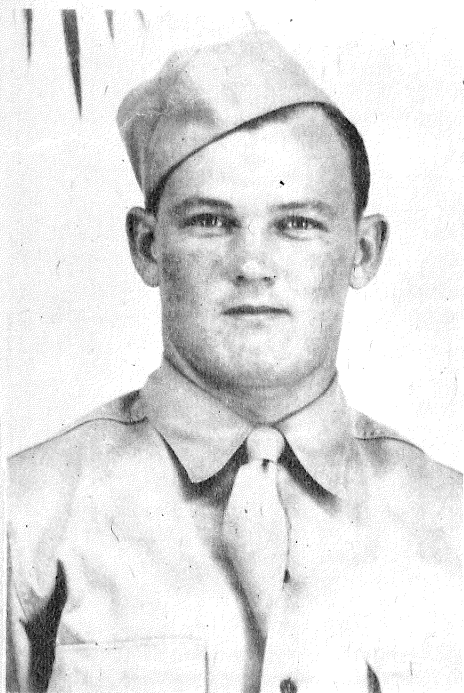
Awarded Air Medal
